Available Naming Opportunities

Gifts of all sizes are needed - naming opportunity is not required

The Family Tower \$2,000,000-\$3,000,000



The 3-story Family Tower, which includes the 20 Family Suites, enables families to have an additional layer of privacy and peace during their stay. Each floor will be accessed by a key-card security system so that only families staying in the Tower have access.

Gifts of \$3 million will include donor name on both the exterior and interior of the building ("Your Name" Family Tower)

Gifts of \$2 million will include donor name on the interior of the building.

<u>Lobby</u> \$1,500,000+

A spot to welcome families and instill a sense of home and comfort. Business leaders, community groups, volunteers and others who tour, prepare meals, or meet in the House are also welcomed here

Entrance Plaza \$750,000+

As families drive up to the House, the welcoming Entrance will present the first sense of the comfort and support they will experience in this home away from home. This beautiful, landscaped area and covered drive will provide a user-friendly place for unloading and welcoming guests and visitors.

Second Floor in Family Tower

\$500,000+

This gift sponsors the 2nd floor of the Family Tower, where families will have a private room away from the activities and everyday noise of common areas in the House.

Multipurpose Conference Room \$400,000+

From family meetings with medical professionals, a workspace for committees, or groups in the community who need a space to meet, this flexible space will have a multitude of uses. Family Movie Night, Santa's Workshop where families choose free gifts to be wrapped by elves, and fundraising events will also take place here.



<u>Generator</u> \$250,000+

The generator is a must. Based on the location of the generator, a design may be incorporated to highlight the donor. This gift will underwrite the cost and service.

Family, Facility & Grounds Security \$200,000+

Keeping families safe is a top priority. This sponsors a comprehensive security system, card access to House and rooms, cameras, and check-in screening system for families and visitors.

Offices \$100,000+

These 4 offices will accommodate our administrative, fundraising and House operations staff.

Well-Being Salon

\$75,000+

Local stylists will volunteer to wash, cut, and style families' hair for free. Whether a child needs his head shaved, a mom needs a moment of care, or dad needs a trim, this space is a place of care.

Volunteer Workspace

\$50,000+

Located in the administrative hub, this is a dedicated space for most of the behind-the-scenes work of volunteers. Whether they are helping with mailings or creating goodie bags for families, volunteers keep the House running with their dedication and huge hearts.

Receiving and Storage

\$50,000+

This essential hub is utilized by staff and volunteers all day, every day. It serves as a dedicated area for supplies, linens, freezers, donations, event items and other storage. The House operates smoothly thanks to the well-stocked and organized receiving and storage room.

Self-Care Station

\$40,000+

Exclusively for caregivers with Day Pass access, this dedicated space includes a full bathroom suite where they can freshen up and wash the day's stress away before returning to their child's hospital bedside.

Facility Laundry Center

\$35,000+

Fresh linens, comforters, and pillows are essential to maintaining a healthy, clean environment for families. Equipped with a commercial washer and dryer, this behind-the-scenes space will be utilized daily by staff to sanitize and care for oversized items.

Community Supporters

Under \$35,000

Gifts of all sizes are needed to build the Ronald McDonald House. Every donor will be recognized on signage in the new House.


A Beacon of Hope
